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This report on Colorado cancer incidence and mortality for 1992-2002 is published by the Colorado Central Cancer Registry (CCCR), which is the cancer surveillance program of the Prevention Services Division in the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE). These statistics are important indicators for Colorado cancer trends and for evaluation of cancer prevention and control efforts. For all cancers combined and for each of seven major cancers, selected statistical findings and a ten-page layout of tables describing incidence, early detection, and mortality are presented in this report. These seven cancers, colon and rec-

tum, lung, melanoma, breast, invasive cervix, prostate, and bladder, are either preventable or detectable at an early and more survivable stage of disease. As the table below shows, they accounted for 65% of all cancers diagnosed in Colorado during 1998-2002. Tables in the report also present incidence, mortality, and early detection information for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and 2001-2002 for counties and state Planning and Management Regions (PMRs, see page 4); statewide 1992-2002 incidence counts and rates by year, sex, and race for over 70 detailed cancer sites; and 1992-2002 mortality counts and rates by year, sex, and race for 30 cancer sites.

The Colorado cancer incidence data for this report come from the CCCR; and the state cancer mortality data are provided by the Health Statistics Section of the CDPHE.

Comparable U.S. cancer incidence and mortality data from 1997-2001 included in this report are from publications of the North American Association of Central Cancer Registries (NAACCR). U.S. cancer mortality data are from all 50 states combined, while U.S. cancer incidence data are combined from 34 population-based central cancer registries, including Colorado. These 34 registries met NAACCR reporting standards and register diagnosed cancers from a combined area that covers 55% of the total U.S. population.

Long-term collection and analysis of cancer data allow the CCCR to identify new patterns in incidence, stage of disease, survival, and mortality. These statistics inform health professionals and citizens about specific cancers, both statewide and in local areas, and can be used to focus cancer control activities, such as developing health services and screening programs. Some of the information presented here can also be used to monitor progress toward statewide cancer objectives for 2010 contained in the Colorado Cancer Plan.

With continuous support from the state of Colorado and assistance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the CCCR has had complete, statewide cancer reporting in Colorado since 1988 with coverage of the entire Denver Metropolitan area since 1979. The CCCR is legislatively authorized under Section 25-1.5-101(1)(q) of Colorado Revised Statutes 2005. Statewide cancer reporting is accomplished through the cooperative efforts of hospitals and hospital tumor registrars, outpatient diagnostic and treatment centers,

pathology laboratories, private physicians, the Health Statistics Section of the CDPHE, and the CCCR.

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Age-adjusted incidence and mortality rates were computed for Colorado cancer cases during 1997-2001 to allow for comparisons to national data collected for this time period. To show time trends these statistics, plus cancer stage percentages, were also computed for 2002. Age-specific rates were computed for cancer cases diagnosed during 1998-2002. For county tabulations, age-adjusted incidence and mortality rates and stage percentages were computed for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and 2001-2002 to show time trends.

Categories of race/ethnicity used in this report were white non-Hispanic, white Hispanic, and black, which together comprise 97% of Colorado's population. The term "Hispanic" is generally used to denote persons of Hispanic origin or Hispanic surname. The "all races" category includes persons of other races (3% of Colorado's population) as well as non-Hispanic whites, blacks, and Hispanics.

Colorado population counts used as denominators for rates were prepared by the Demography Section of the Colorado Department of Local Affairs and provided to the CCCR by the Health Statistics Section of the CDPHE. These population counts were 2004-based estimates by race/ethnicity, sex, and age. Multiple-race responses allowed in the 2000 Census were redistributed by the Demography Section using a proportional share model to match 1990 Census groups.

Colorado mortality data, obtained from the Health Statistics Section of the CDPHE, were from 1992-2002 deaths for which cancer was determined to be the underlying cause of death. U.S. 1997-2001 incidence and mortality data were from publications of the North American Association of Central Cancer Registries.

In keeping with registration practices nationwide, skin cancer data includes melanomas and excludes basal cell and squamous cell carcinomas.

**Average annual age-adjusted rates** help reduce chance fluctuations in data that occur from one year to the next. The age-adjusted rates allow for comparisons of rates in different populations and over different time periods. Any observed differences in age-adjusted rates will not be due to differing age structures of the populations compared. The rates in this report were adjusted by the direct method to the 2000 U.S. standard population. In the direct method, the age-specific rate for each group is multiplied by the portion of the U.S. standard population that is in that age group. The resulting numbers are summed, yielding an age-adjusted rate.

**Tables in this report cannot be compared to tables in CCCR reports released prior to 2002 due to a change in the standard year used for calculating age-adjusted rates.** Publications of the CCCR released prior to 2002 have age-adjusted rates based on the 1970 U.S. standard population. Starting with publications released in 2002, rates have been age-adjusted using the 2000 U.S. standard, which is a procedure adopted by all federal and state agencies to reflect age changes in the U.S. and to move toward a single age-adjustment standard for all diseases.

NAACCR studies have shown that cancer rates age-adjusted to the new 2000 standard still have the same time trend slopes as rates adjusted to the old 1970 standard. However, rates age-adjusted to the 2000 standard will appear to be about 15-20% higher than rates age-adjusted to the old 1970 standard which illustrates why *rates in this report cannot be compared to rates in reports released prior to 2002.*

**Standard errors (S.E.) of rates** are a measure of the reliability or precision of calculated rates. Rates based on larger

populations have smaller standard errors while rates based on smaller populations have larger standard errors. Although standard errors are not presented in these tables, an approximation of the standard error of a particular incidence or mortality rate can be derived from the following formula:

$$S.E. = rate / \sqrt{events}$$

Events refer to the number of cancer diagnoses associated with an incidence rate or the number of deaths associated with a mortality rate.

**An approximate test to compare two rates statistically** can be calculated using the following formula:

$$Z = (rate_1 - rate_2) / \sqrt{(S.E._1^2 + S.E._2^2)}$$

S.E. is the standard error of the rate. If the absolute value of Z is greater than 1.96, the two rates are significantly different at a p-value of 0.05. This test can be inaccurate for rates based on fewer than 10 cases, and it was not used for rates based on fewer than six cases.

This statistical test was used to compare 1997-2001 U.S. and Colorado incidence and mortality rates and to compare Colorado 1997-2001 incidence and mortality rates to rates for 2002. Based on this test, Colorado incidence and mortality rates that were statistically higher or lower than the selected comparison rate were marked with symbols in the appropriate age-adjusted rate tables.

Also, this test was used to compare incidence and mortality rates for Hispanics to non-Hispanic whites, and for blacks to non-Hispanic whites, within the U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001. The test was likewise used to compare 2002 rates for His-

panics to non-Hispanic whites, and blacks to non-Hispanic whites. Those race/ethnicity comparisons that tested statistically high or low were marked with symbols in the appropriate age-adjusted rate tables.

The z-test was also used to compare Colorado incidence and mortality rates with county rates and Planning and Management Region (PMR, see figure below) rates for three time periods: 1992-98, 1999-2000, and 2001-02. Higher or lower rates that were not statistically significant may be described in this report if they were part of a pattern of high or low rates or were very close to statistical significance. Rates, especially those based on rare cancers or small populations, can fluctuate from one time period to the next. Because of the small number of cases, differences in these rates are often not statistically significant.

**A time-trend test based on the estimated annual percent change** was conducted for the 1992-2002 time period for both incidence and mortality rates in Colorado for the major cancer sites. The estimated annual percent change (EAPC) is calculated by first fitting a regression line to the natural logarithm of the annual rates using calendar year as a regressor variable. This calculation assumes that the rates increased or decreased at a constant rate over the entire calendar year interval. In those instances where at least one of the rates was zero, or for mortality rates based on fewer than three deaths, the linear regression was not calculated.

Testing the hypothesis that the actual mean annual percent change is zero is equivalent to testing the hypothesis that the theoretical slope estimated by the slope of the regression line is zero. A t-test with nine degrees of freedom was used to evaluate the significance of the time trends. Time trends with statistically significant values for the EAPC were marked with symbols indicating either increasing or decreasing trends. A negative value for an EAPC indicates a decreasing trend.

**Cancer incidence and mortality rates** measure the number of new invasive diagnoses and deaths from an underlying cause, respectively, per 100,000 population during a defined period of time. Incidence rates exclude in situ cancers (see **Stage of disease** below).

**Age-specific rates** are incidence rates for particular age groups and are commonly grouped by five-year age ranges.

**Cumulative risk**, an estimate of the chance of an individual being diagnosed with

cancer by a particular age, e.g., by age 85, was computed based on Colorado 1998-2002 age-specific rates. The cumulative risk is a function of the cumulative rate. The cumulative rate equals the sum of each five-year age-specific rate, expressed as a decimal fraction, multiplied by five to account for the five-year age intervals and multiplied by 100 to express the cumulative rate as a percentage.

$$\text{Cumulative risk} = 100(1 - e^{-(\text{cumulative rate}/100)}).$$

It can be expressed as a percentage or a probability, e.g., for men the cumulative risk to age 85 for all cancers combined is about 51% or a probability of cancer of about 1 in 2. This method may result in slightly different risks than those quoted by the American Cancer Society, which have been computed by the life-table approach used by the National Cancer Institute (see **References** in *Background and Data Sources* section).

**Stage of disease** at the time of cancer diagnosis is typically defined by size and containment, or spread, of the tumor. One of the schemes for staging, SEER summary stage, has allowed for historical comparisons over time. (A new summary stage definition, starting with the year 2001, is not completely consistent with the earlier version, and national groups are evaluating the effect of this change.) Summary stage includes the categories of in situ, localized, regional, and distant spread. The preinvasive stage of a malignant tumor is called in situ stage and is usually highly curable. In the earliest invasive stage of cancer, the localized stage, the tumor is confined to the organ of origin. Regional stage indicates spread to adjacent organs and/or lymph nodes, and distant stage refers to a tumor that has spread to distant organs or lymph nodes.



**HIGHLIGHTS**

- > In Colorado, the cumulative lifetime risk of cancer is 1 in 2 for males and 2 in 5 for females.
- > Colorado 1997-2001 cancer incidence rates were 4-7% lower than U.S. rates mostly due to lower rates of lung and colorectal cancer.
- > During 1992-2002 among males, every race/ethnicity group in this report had a drop in incidence rates of 1-2% per year mainly due to decreases in colorectal, lung, and prostate cancer.
- > Colorado cancer mortality rates for blacks during 1997-2001 were 17-34% higher than rates for non-Hispanic whites.
- > Colorado 1997-2001 cancer mortality rates were 10-17% lower than U.S. rates and changed little from 1997-2001 to 2002.
- > During 1992-2002, statistically significant decreases in cancer death rates were seen for non-Hispanic white males (down 1% per year) and non-Hispanic white females (down less than 1% per year).

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 incidence rates of all cancers combined for males and females of the collective races in Colorado were 4-7% lower than 1997-2001 incidence rates for U.S. males and females. Rates for Colorado non-Hispanic white males and females were 2-4% lower than U.S. rates. Rates for black males and females were 11-16% lower than U.S. rates. These changes were mostly due to lower rates of lung and colorectal cancer among males and females.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Incidence rates of all cancers combined changed little from 1997-2001 to 2002. However, for the longer time period, 1992-2002, every race group among males had a drop in incidence rates of about 1-2% per year mainly due to decreases in colorectal, lung, and prostate cancer incidence. Black females showed a significant rate decrease of about 1% per year. Hispanic females showed a significant rate increase of about 1% per year.

**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Sex.** Colorado incidence rates of all cancers combined for blacks and Hispanics were generally different from rates for non-Hispanic whites. During 1997-2001 and 2002, incidence rates for black males were comparable to the rates for non-Hispanic whites, but death rates were 20-34% higher. The incidence rate for black females was 18% lower during 1997-2001 and 21% lower in 2002 than the rate for non-Hispanic white females, yet the death rate was higher in black females. Incidence rates for Hispanic males and females were 10% lower than rates for non-Hispanic whites during 1997-2001 and 2002, with death rates showing a similar pattern.


**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Early detection of all cancers combined improved from one to two percentage points from 1997-2001 to 2002 in Colorado, except for blacks

whose cancer early detection worsened one percentage point.

**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Mortality rates for all cancers combined for Colorado males and females during 1997-2001 were 10-17% lower than U.S. rates except for Hispanics whose rates were 6-8% higher than U.S. rates for Hispanics. During 2002 in Colorado, cancer mortality rates were generally down 2-21% from the 1997-2001 time period varying by race/ethnicity and gender. During 1992-2002, rates for non-Hispanic white males dropped 1% per year. The only statistically significant change in rates for females was for non-Hispanic whites whose rate declined less than 1% per year.

**Comparisons between Colorado Counties and the State by Sex.** For males, incidence rates for all cancers combined in several counties for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02 were statistically elevated (or showed a pattern at least 20% higher than the state). These counties included Adams, Denver, El Paso, Garfield, Gunnison, Mesa, Moffat, and Otero. Higher mortality rates for males were seen in Adams, Baca, Denver, El Paso, Kit Carson, Ouray, and Prowers Counties. These county incidence and mortality elevations in males were due mostly to higher rates of lung, colorectal, and/or prostate cancers. For females, using the same criteria for males above, higher cancer incidence rates were seen in the counties of Boulder, Denver, El Paso, Garfield, Logan, and Ouray. Higher mortality rates for females were seen in Adams, Archuleta, Denver, Mesa, and Saguache Counties. These county incidence and mortality elevations in females were due mostly to higher rates for lung, breast, cervix, and/or colorectal cancers.



> Colorado 1997-2001 bladder cancer incidence rates were about 10% lower than U.S. rates.

> During 1997-2001, bladder cancer incidence rates for Hispanics and blacks were 44-54% lower than rates for non-Hispanic whites in Colorado.

> During 1992-2002, bladder cancer incidence rates for Hispanic males and females each decreased about 4% per year.

> Mortality rates for bladder cancer in Colorado during 1997-2001 were 4-29% lower than U.S. mortality rates.

> In Colorado from 1997-2001 to 2002, bladder cancer mortality rates changed little, but the rate for non-Hispanic white men increased 32%.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Sex, Race, and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 bladder cancer incidence rates in Colorado were 8-36% lower than U.S. rates, varying by race/ethnicity and sex.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Bladder cancer incidence rates in Colorado remained fairly stable between 1997-2001 and 2002, but during 1992-2002 incidence rates for Hispanic males and females each decreased about 4% per year.


**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Sex.** During 1997-2001, bladder cancer incidence rates for black and Hispanic males and females ranged from 44% to 54% lower than rates for non-Hispanic whites. Rates for 2002 showed generally similar differences between race/ethnicity groups.

**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** There was little change in early detection of bladder cancer in Colorado over this time period.

**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Mortality rates for bladder cancer in Colorado during 1997-2001 were 4-29% lower than U.S. mortality rates, varying by race/ethnicity and sex. As with incidence rates, mortality rates tended to be lower in Hispanics and blacks than in non-Hispanic whites. In Colorado from 1997-2001 to 2002, bladder cancer mortality rates changed little, but the rate for white, non-Hispanic men increased 32%.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado by Sex.** Counties with statistically elevated bladder cancer incidence rates for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02 (or a pattern of rates at least 20% higher than the state) included Adams, Chaffee, Fremont, Larimer, and Weld for males and Mesa for females. Using the same criteria, Planning and Management Regions (PMRs) with elevated incidence rates were PMRs 2, 11, and 13 for males and PMR 11 for females. The mortality rate for Adams county males during 1992-98 and 1999-2000 was about 50% above the state rate.



- > The 1997-2001 breast cancer incidence rate in Colorado was 3% higher than the U.S. rate, while the Colorado mortality rate was 13% lower.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Race and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 breast cancer incidence rate in Colorado was 3% higher than the U.S. rate with the rate for the white, non-Hispanic group being 6% above the U.S. rate.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Breast cancer incidence rates decreased 3-6% between 1997-2001 and 2002 for non-Hispanic whites and Hispanics. For breast cancer during 1992-2002, incidence rates climbed about 1% per year for white, non-Hispanic women, and declined less than 1% per year for Hispanic and black women.

**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002.** Colorado Hispanic and black females continued to have lower breast cancer incidence rates than non-Hispanic whites in 1997-2001 and 2002. Rates for Hispanic and black females were 26-30% lower in 1997-2001 and 24-26% lower in 2002.

**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Early detection of breast cancer in Colorado improved between 1997-2001 and 2002 for each of the race/ethnicity groups in this report and early detection for Hispanics increased over 5 percentage points.


**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Race and Ethnicity.** The mortality rate for breast cancer in Colorado for all females during 1997-2001 was 13% lower than the U.S. rate. The mortality rate for all Colorado females decreased 3% from 1997-2001 to 2002; the rate was constant among non-Hispanic whites, down 26% among Hispanics, and down 16% among blacks. Colorado breast cancer mortality rates during 1997-2001 were 24% lower for Hispanics than for non-Hispanic whites. This comparison reflects similarly lower incidence rates among

Hispanics. However, breast cancer mortality rates for black females were substantially higher than rates for non-Hispanic white females, 33% higher during 1997-2001. During 1992-2002, the trend in breast cancer mortality rates for blacks fluctuated resulting in little change, but among white, non-Hispanic women the rate dropped 2% per year and among Hispanic women the rate dropped about 3% per year.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado.** Counties with statistically elevated breast cancer incidence rates for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02 (or a pattern of rates at least 20% higher than the state) included Boulder, Denver, Chaffee, and Custer. Also, mortality rates for Weld County during 1999-2000 and 2001-02 were 22% and 30% above state rates, respectively, even though incidence rates were lower than state rates.

Early detection leads to better survival, and in Colorado during 1999-2000 and 2001-02, close to 73% of breast cancers were detected "early" (in situ and localized stages). However, 11 counties and three PMR areas (6, 9, and 14) had early detection rates of 70% or less during both time periods. The 11 counties were Crowley, Huerfano, La Plata, Moffat, Montezuma, Morgan, Otero, Prowers, Rio Blanco, San Miguel, and Washington. In addition, nine other counties that had early detection rates of over 70% in 1999-2000 dropped to 70% or less in 2001-02. The counties were Bent, Delta, Douglas, Fremont, Gilpin, Gunnison, Las Animas, Montrose, and Park.



**HIGHLIGHTS**

- > In Colorado, the cumulative lifetime risk of invasive cervical cancer is 1 in 151.
- > The Colorado 1997-2001 invasive cervical cancer incidence rate for all females was 22% below the U.S. rate, but the rate in Colorado Hispanics continued its two-fold elevation above that of non-Hispanic whites.
- > There were modest cervical cancer incidence rate declines in Colorado from 1997-2001 to 2002.
- > Trends in cervical cancer incidence rates during 1992-2002 were generally favorable with drops of 4% per year for non-Hispanic whites and Hispanics.
- > Hispanics and blacks with invasive cervical cancer in Colorado in 2002 were detected later than non-Hispanic whites.
- > The mortality trend for cervical cancer in Colorado from 1997-2001 to 2002 was down 10%, and the trend during 1992-2002 showed drops of 5% per year for non-Hispanic whites and Hispanics.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Race and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 incidence rate of invasive cervical cancer for all females in Colorado was 22% below the U.S. rate. The Colorado rate for non-Hispanic whites was 24% below the U.S. rate for whites and the Colorado rate for blacks was 57% lower than the rate for U.S. blacks.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** There were modest cervical cancer incidence rate decreases in Colorado from 1997-2001 to 2002, ranging from 6-14%, except for blacks whose rate climbed 57%, though based on small numbers. Trends in incidence rates during 1992-2002 showed the rate dropping 4% per year for both non-Hispanic whites and Hispanics.

**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002.** In Colorado, the incidence rate of invasive cervical cancer in Hispanics continued its two-fold elevation above that of non-Hispanic whites during 1997-2001 and 2002.

**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Since in situ cervical tumors are not reported to the CCCR, a time trend for these early tumors cannot be tracked. However, limiting the analysis to invasive tumors, there was improvement in early detection of these cervical cancers based on increases in the proportion of localized stage in Colorado for non-Hispanic whites between 1997-2001 and 2002. In contrast, Hispanics and blacks with invasive cervical cancer had declines in early stage detection between 1997-2001 and 2002; and their cancers were detected later than those of non-Hispanic whites in 2002.


**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Race and Ethnicity.** The mortality rate for cervical cancer in Colorado during 1997-2001 was 31% lower than the U.S. rate. For non-Hispanic

whites in Colorado, the mortality rate was 24% lower, and for blacks, the rate was 46% lower than U.S. rates. The mortality trend from 1997-2001 to 2002 in Colorado was down 10%. The trend in cervical cancer mortality rates during 1992-2002 was equally favorable with the rate for non-Hispanic whites and Hispanics declining almost 5% per year. There were very few deaths among blacks.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado.** Denver and Weld counties had statistically elevated cervical cancer incidence rates for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02. PMR 8 had a pattern of higher incidence rates plus a statistically high mortality rate during 2001-02. Adams and El Paso counties also had mortality rates higher than state rates.

Early detection leads to better survival, and since the earliest tumors, in situ stage, are not reported to the CCCR, county-specific tables present localized stage percentages as an estimate of early detection, albeit only within the invasive cases. Localized stage tumors have close to 95% five-year survival. Most larger counties had localized stage percentages similar to statewide data and many smaller counties had too few cases to display percentages. PMRs 4, 6, 9, and 10 had lower percentages of localized stage, i.e., later detection, than seen statewide.



> In Colorado, the cumulative lifetime risk of colon and rectal cancer is 1 in 13 for males and 1 in 17 for females.

> Colorado 1997-2001 colon and rectal cancer incidence rates were 4-25% lower than U.S. rates.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Sex, Race, and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 Colorado colon and rectal cancer incidence rates for all races combined, non-Hispanic whites, and blacks were 4-25% lower than comparable U.S. rates.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Most race/ethnicity groups in Colorado had decreases in incidence rates of colon and rectal cancer between 1997-2001 and 2002. Black females had the largest rate decrease at 59%, while the rate for black males increased 13%. During 1992-2002, although each race/ethnicity group for both genders had modest decreases or no change in incidence rates, only the 5% per year decline in the incidence rate for black females was statistically significant.

**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Sex.** During 1997-2001, Hispanic males and black females had 17% and 25% higher incidence rates of colon and rectal cancer, respectively, than their non-Hispanic white counterparts.

**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Only Hispanics showed improvements in earlier detection of colon and rectal cancer between 1997-2001 and 2002 in Colorado. For all races combined, about 44% of cases in 1997-2001 and 43% of cases in 2002 were detected “early” (in situ and localized stages), which is associated with 5-year survival of close to 90%.


**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Colon and rectal cancer mortality rates in Colorado during 1997-2001 were 3-19% lower than U.S. rates, varying by race/ethnicity and sex, except for male Hispanics, whose rate was 21% higher than the U.S. rate for Hispanics. In addition, during 1992-2002, most race/ethnicity and gender groups had 1-3% per year decreases in mortality

rates. The exceptions were the rates for Hispanic and black males, which increased about 1% and 2% per year, respectively.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado by Sex.** For males, colorectal cancer incidence rates in Adams and El Paso counties for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02 were statistically elevated (or showed a pattern at least 20% higher than the state). For females, using the same criteria, higher incidence rates were seen in the counties of Denver, Garfield, Logan, Montezuma, and Otero. For males, mortality rates were statistically higher in the counties of Adams, El Paso, and Yuma. Males in Pueblo and Prowers counties and PMR 14, comprising Huerfano and Las Animas counties, also had a pattern of higher colorectal cancer mortality rates, plus elevated incidence rates for 1999-2000 and 2001-02.

Early detection leads to better survival, and in Colorado approximately 44% of cases statewide were detected “early” (in situ and localized stages) during 1999-2000 and 2001-02. However, 10 counties and PMRs 6 and 9 had early detection rates of 40% or less in both time periods. The 10 counties were Adams, Alamosa, Archuleta, Conejos, Crowley, Douglas, La Plata, Montezuma, Prowers, and Yuma. Additionally, seven other counties and three other PMRs (5, 10, and 11) that had early detection rates in 1999-2000 of over 40% dropped to 40% or less during 2001-02. The counties were Delta, Elbert, Eagle, Grand, Montrose, Park, and Rio Blanco.



- > In Colorado, the cumulative lifetime risk of lung cancer is 1 in 10 for males and 1 in 16 for females.
- > The 1997-2001 Colorado lung cancer incidence rates were generally 18-25% below U.S. rates, varying by race/ethnicity and sex.
- > Lung cancer incidence and mortality rates changed little for Colorado men from 1997-2001 to 2002, but for women incidence rates generally increased and the mortality rate among Hispanic women climbed 38%.
- > During 1992-2002 in Colorado, lung cancer incidence rates for non-Hispanic white men decreased 2% per year while rates for women increased 1-3% per year.
- > The 1997-2001 Colorado lung cancer incidence rates for black men and women were 4-26% higher than the rates for non-Hispanic whites.
- > During 1992-2002 in Colorado, lung cancer mortality rates for men decreased 2% per year, yet rates increased 1-3% per year for females.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Sex, Race, and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 Colorado lung cancer incidence rates were 18-25% lower than U.S. rates. This was true for both sexes and all available race/ethnicity group comparisons, except for black females, whose Colorado rate was similar to the U.S. rate for black females.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Colorado lung cancer incidence rates for males showed little change from 1997-2001 to 2002. For females, rates generally increased 4-22% over this time period. During 1992-2002, lung cancer incidence rates for non-Hispanic white males decreased 2% per year while rates for females increased 1-3% per year, varying by race and ethnicity.

**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Sex.** The 1997-2001 Colorado lung cancer incidence rate for black males was 26% higher than the rate for non-Hispanic white males, and for 2002 the rate for black males was 36% higher. Over these time periods lung cancer incidence rates for black females were 4-22% higher than rates for non-Hispanic white females. Rates for Hispanics were 14-23% lower than rates for non-Hispanic whites, varying by sex and time period. A notable exception was the rate for Hispanic males in 2002, which was just above that of non-Hispanic white males.


**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Half of Colorado lung cancers in these time periods, regardless of race/ethnicity, were detected at distant stage, which is associated with five-year survival of only 2%.

**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Colorado lung cancer mortality rates during 1997-2001 were 3-31% lower than U.S. rates for all sex and race/ethnicity groups, except for black females, whose rate was 5% higher than the U.S. rate for black females. For males in Colorado, from 1997-2001 to 2002, there was little change in lung cancer mortality rates. For females, the most sobering change was a 38% increase in the lung cancer mortality rate for Hispanics over this time period. During 1992-2002 in Colorado, lung cancer mortality rates decreased about 2% per year for males, yet increased 1-2% per year for females.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado by Sex.** For males, lung cancer incidence rates in several counties and PMRs were statistically elevated for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02, (or showed a pattern at least 20% higher than the state). These areas included PMRs 7, 11, and 13 and the counties of Adams, Denver, Fremont, Logan, Mesa, Montrose, Prowers, and Pueblo. Additionally, males in PMR 6 had lung cancer incidence rates 17-19% higher than state rates for all three time periods. For females, rates were statistically higher or showed a pattern at least 20% higher than the state in PMRs 4 and 11 and the counties of Adams, Arapahoe, Chaffee, El Paso, Fremont, Prowers, and Mesa.

Many of the areas with statistically elevated lung cancer incidence rates compared to the state rate also had elevated mortality rates. These areas for males were PMRs 6 and 11 and the counties of Adams, Denver, Mesa, and Prowers. For females, higher mortality rates were seen in PMR 11 and the counties of Adams and Mesa.



- > In Colorado, the cumulative lifetime risk of melanoma is 1 in 33 for males and 1 in 62 for females.
- > The 1997-2001 Colorado melanoma incidence rate for males was 30% higher than U.S. rates and for females was 32% higher.
- > The Colorado melanoma incidence rate for non-Hispanic white males climbed 2% from 1997-2001 to 2002 while the rate for females climbed 6%.
- > During 1992-2002 in Colorado, the incidence rate of melanoma for non-Hispanic white males increased 3% per year while the rate increased 2% per year for females.
- > Melanoma mortality rates for Colorado males were 18% higher than U.S. rates in 1997-2001, but declined 26% in 2002.
- > Melanoma mortality rates in Colorado during 1992-2002 were fairly stable.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Sex, Race, and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 Colorado melanoma incidence rate for males was 30% higher than comparable U.S. rates, and for females was 32% higher.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Colorado melanoma incidence rates for non-Hispanic white males climbed 2% from 1997-2001 to 2002 while rates for females in this group climbed 6%. During 1992-2002, the incidence rate of melanoma for non-Hispanic white males in Colorado increased 3% per year while the rate increased 2% per year for females.


**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Sex.** Melanoma rates in Hispanics and blacks were much lower than in non-Hispanic whites.

**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Based on in situ and localized stage categories, there was little change in early detection of melanomas in Colorado from 1997-2001 to 2002. The Colorado Cancer Coalition has adopted an alternative definition of "early", namely, less than 1.00 mm Breslow depth or in situ stage. Using this definition, the 2010 goal for early detection is 85%. The 2000 baseline in Colorado was 81% of melanomas detected early, while 2001 and 2002 statistics showed early detection percentages of 81% and 79%, respectively.

**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Sex and Race/Ethnicity.** Mortality rates for melanomas in Colorado males for 1997-2001 were 18% higher than U.S. rates, but declined 26% in 2002. The trend in mortality rates during 1992-2002 was fairly stable.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado by Sex.** For males, melanoma incidence rates in several areas for 1992-98, 1999-2000, and/or 2001-02 were statistically elevated (or showed a pattern at least 20% higher than the state). These areas included PMRs 4, 9, 11, and 12 and the counties of Douglas, El Paso, Garfield, La Plata, Mesa, and Teller. For females, using the same criteria, higher rates were seen in PMRs 9 and 10 and the counties of Boulder, Delta, Douglas, and Jefferson.



- > In Colorado, the cumulative lifetime risk of prostate cancer is 1 in 5.
- > The 1997-2001 prostate cancer incidence rate in Colorado for non-Hispanic whites was 7% higher than the U.S. rate for whites (which includes Hispanics, whose rate is lower); the rate for blacks was 19% lower than the U.S. rate for blacks.
- > During 1992-2002 in Colorado, each race/ethnicity group in this report had an average decrease in incidence rates of 2-3% per year.
- > Early detection of prostate cancer in Colorado improved from 1997-2001 to 2002 in every race/ethnicity group in this report. For 2002, early detection in Hispanics and blacks lagged 3-6 percentage points behind that of non-Hispanic whites.

## Narrative of Selected Findings

**Incidence Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 by Race and Ethnicity.** The 1997-2001 prostate cancer incidence rate for all races combined in Colorado was similar to the U.S. rate. The rate for non-Hispanic whites was 7% higher than the U.S. rate, and the rate for blacks was 19% lower than the U.S. rate for blacks.

**Incidence Trends in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** There was little change in prostate cancer incidence rates in Colorado between 1997-2001 and 2002. During 1992-2002, each race/ethnicity group in this report had a statistically significant average decrease in rates of 2-3% per year.

**Incidence Comparisons in Colorado between Race/Ethnicity Groups for 1997-2001 and 2002.** The 1997-2001 Colorado prostate cancer incidence rate in blacks was 20% higher than the rate for non-Hispanic whites, and 18% higher in 2002. Incidence rates during 1997-2001 and 2002 for Hispanics were 11-14% lower than rates for non-Hispanic whites.


**Stage Comparisons in Colorado for 1997-2001 and 2002 by Race/Ethnicity.** Early detection of prostate cancer in Colorado improved from 1997-2001 to 2002 in every race and ethnicity group in this report. For 2002, early detection of prostate cancer in Hispanics and blacks lagged 3-6 percentage points behind that of non-Hispanic whites.

**Mortality Comparisons between U.S. and Colorado for 1997-2001 and Mortality Trend in Colorado for 1992-2002 by Race and Ethnicity.** The mortality rate for prostate cancer for all races combined in Colorado during 1997-2001 was 5% lower than the U.S. rate. The trend in Colorado mortality rates from 1992 to 2002 was down about 4% per year for non-Hispanic whites and down 1% per year for Hispanics, but was quite variable year-to-year for blacks. Also, the Colorado mortality rate for blacks was more than double the rate for non-Hispanic whites for 1997-2001 and 68% higher in 2002.

**Comparisons between Counties and Colorado.** Areas with statistically higher prostate cancer incidence rates for 1992-98, 1999-2000, or 2001-02 (or a pattern of rates at least 20% higher than the state) included PMRs 3, 10, and 11 and the counties of Arapahoe, Boulder, Delta, Garfield, Gunnison, Mesa, Montrose, Moffat, Phillips, and Routt. These higher rates were generally transient over time and likely a result of early detection differences due to PSA testing. For some time periods, Denver and La Plata County and PMR 8 had prostate cancer mortality rates that were above state rates, while incidence rates were not elevated.

The overall state rate of early detection of prostate cancer was 85% during 1999-2000 and 87% during 2001-02, yet three counties, La Plata, Montezuma, and Phillips, had early detection rates of 80% or less during both time periods. PMRs 5 and 9 and six other counties had early detection rates during 1999-2000 of over 80% that dropped to 80% or less during 2001-02. These counties were Costilla, Custer, Elbert, Jackson, Moffat, and Saguache.
